

TONY ANDERSON




Tony Anderson took over as General Manager of Cherryland Electric Cooperative in March of 2003. Anderson has been in the electric cooperative business for more than 35 years and previously managed cooperatives in Wisconsin and Wyoming. Tony has been married to his last prom date, Mary, for 35 years. They have 3 children and 4 grandchildren. Community activities include being the recipient of the 2018 Traverse City Area Chamber of Commerce Distinguished Service Award, 2012 Governor's Service Awards Michigan Volunteer of the Year, Past Chair of Traverse City Chamber board, current Board member and past President of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Northwestern Michigan, member of noon Rotary Club, and founder of Marathon4Kids, a charitable fundraiser for BBBS. Anderson is also Secretary Treasurer of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association and Vice President of the Michigan Electric Cooperative Association. Hobbies include Green Bay Packers football, writing and running marathons. Tony has completed 46 marathons in 46 states while raising over \$460,000 for Big Brothers Big Sisters of NW Michigan.

MATT PAISS

Matthew Paiss serves as an Advisor, Battery Materials & Systems for Pacific Northwest National Labs. Prior, he spent 23 years with the San Jose Fire Department retiring as a Fire Captain. His career in solar started in 1982 at ARCO Solar in Camarillo, CA before studying Solar Technology and Fire Science. He is involved in various Codes & Standards committees including NFPA 70 (NEC) and NFPA 855 Energy Storage Systems, and UL Standards Technical Panels 61703 & 1741, and 3741. He is a subject matter expert for the National Fire Protection Association on energy storage. He has contributed to the IFC & NFPA1 fire code sections on PV & ESS. Mr. Paiss has delivered electrical safety training to over 8000 firefighters nationwide including the FDIC and the National Fire Academy. He has spoken in Europe on fire safety and PV design and holds certificates as Registered CA State Fire Instructor, and Certified State Fire Officer.

He has written for Fire Engineering, Home Power, SolarPro and SFPE magazines.

Captain Jerry Linenger is a retired United States I graduate, he holds doctorates in both medicine a and Systems Management. He has also been awa





During what has been reported to be one of the most dangerous and dramatic missions in space history, Linenger spent nearly five months aboard the Russian space station Mir. He faced numerous life-threatening events, including repeated failure of critical life-support systems, a near-collision between the space station and an incoming re-supply spacecraft and computer failures that sent the space station tumbling uncontrollably through space. As if these problems were not enough, he narrowly survived a raging out-of-control fire that was later described as the most severe fire ever aboard an orbiting spacecraft.

In spite of these challenges, Linenger and his two Russian crewmates accomplished all mission goals: shuttle docking, space walking, a Soyuz fly around and all 120 of the science experiments. In completing the mission, he logged 50 million miles, the equivalent distance of over 110 round trips to the moon, traveling at a speed of nearly 18,000 miles per hour. He was the first American ever to undock from a space station in a Russian Soyuz capsule and the first American to do a spacewalk in a Russian spacesuit. At mission completion, Linenger held the endurance record for the longest time in space for an American man. In 2008, NASA awarded Linenger the Distinguished Service Medal, the highest award conferred by NASA, citing his courage and outstanding service to our country.

Linenger is author of the books Off the Planet, which chronicles his time in space; and Letters from Mir: An Astronauts Letters to His Son. He collaborated with National Geographic Explorer on The Angel Effect, a documentary revealing how he was able to endure the solitary conditions of his mission and the science behind the "Third Man Factor." He is a founding board member of the global freshwater think tank Circle of Blue and has been awarded the 2012 Royal Canadian Geographical Society's Gold Medal in recognition of his remarkable achievements in space. He has appeared in numerous documentaries seen on Discovery, Nova, History Channel, PBS and National Geographic Television. As a space analyst, Linenger is seen frequently on NBC's Today, Nightly News, as well as on various CBS, CNN, PBS and FOX news shows. He has also worked behind the scenes as scientific advisor to various futuristic voyages to Mars films.

In 2016, Linenger was prominently featured in Discovery's eight-part series, Secret Space Escapes, and is presently narrating a National Geographic program focusing on Planet Earth. A full-feature movie based on his book and his life is also currently being filmed.

In his free time, Linenger enjoys bicycling, ice hockey, swimming, and stand-up paddle-boarding. He now lives back on the planet in northern Michigan with his wife, Kathryn, and their four children.

Zach Spicer began his career at Dickson Electric System in April 2004 after an impressive career as a Nuclear Biological Chemical Defense Specialist in the United States Marine Corps. In March 2004, Zach ended his tour with the Marine Corps as Sergeant and began working as an Apprentice Lineman for DES. Zach worked his way up to a Journeyman Lineman before transitioning to substation work in 2013. Zach took over as the Substation Maintenance Supervisor in 2016 where he oversees the monitoring, maintenance, and general operations of eight electrical distribution substations which serve 35,000 customers across Middle Tennessee. Zach and his wife share four children. Both his home and work family have been his greatest support system and source of strength throughout his recovery from a life-changing accident that occurred August 25, 2017.



BRAD LIVINGSTON & KAYLA RATH Keynote Speakers

After being employed by a natural gas pipeline company for 10 years, Brad Livingston was involved in back-to-back explosions that were 100% preventable. Brad, now a Motivational Safety Speaker, speaks about the contributing factors to these explosions. These factors are the same as what exists in EVERY type company EVERYWHERE - Shortcuts; Complacency; Pride; Bad Attitudes; Improper Perspectives. Brad overcame a 5% chance of surviving his injuries and now shares his story.

Kayla Rath was only nine years old when her father, Brad, was involved in these explosions. For three months, Kayla and her two sisters lived with family

members while their mother sat with Brad as he fought to stay alive in a Texas hospital. The accident still impacts the family today. Kayla, now a Professional Safety Speaker, shares her story and what it's like to grow up with her father's unsafe decision, impacting her life for the past 25 years.

It's not about him, it's about the kids

For distance runner Tony Anderson, now closing in on the last eight of an epic 50 state and DC marathon journey to raise money for BIGS (Big Brothers Big Sisters) of Northwest Michigan, his focus has been unrelenting---giving kids a chance at a better life.

Becoming a Big Brother and forming Marathon4Kids in 2009 as a way of raising money for BIGS, changed Tony's life course. It has also changed the lives of countless "bigs" and "littles," and their families---all members of the five-county Big Brothers Big Sisters organization of NW Michigan.

Since then he has finished 46 marathons in 46 states; raised over \$460,000; accumulated 15,000 plus running miles; and has been key to growing BIGS matches, which this year will top 400.

When joining the organization in 2005, Tony made it clear he was not a money raiser. "I hate asking people for money."

But enroute to a marathon in Seattle, he met a group of runners using the event to leverage funds for cancer research. "That got me to thinking that if I run a marathon for BIGS, then perhaps I'm worthy to ask for money."

It has not always been easy.

His marathon "not a sprint" journey has included hip surgery, nagging run related issues, completing back-to-back marathons the same weekend, and finishing two marathons over a week's time span, on several occasions.

What makes Tony run?

The loss of his father at a young age, the influence of his grandfather, and a formative life lived in a trailer park in South Dakota, are never far from his memories.

"This is what fuels my desire to run marathons that will make life better for kids," he explains.

All runs are self funded. And Tony figures that for every \$1 spent traveling, \$5 is raised for BIGS. "This is not a waste of time or dollars. I have a story to tell, and your burden is lifted when you can tell your story. In my case, this is why I run for BIGS."


SLEEPING BEAR DUNES TOUR

The Sleeping Bear Dunes National Lakeshore is rich in history from early Native American cultures to the shipping, logging, and agricultural heritage of the area. Even the name of the area comes from the Native American Legend of Sleeping Bear. 
